Come along to the Winter Festival on *Thursday 17 February from 1pm-5pm* at the Nexus Centre, and meet the Bellway team who are working together with Waltham Forest Council on the redevelopment of the Avenue Road Estate.

We will be sharing some early ideas about the plans for the estate and our team will be on hand to chat and answer any questions you may have! There will also be the opportunity to get creative and tell us what you would like to see on the new site.

UP Projects and artist Rachel Jenkins from Genuine Fake will be running "Edible Estate" - a creative workshop that invites local residents to build their own estate whilst putting forward their hopes and ideas for how community and culture can sit at the heart of the new development. This workshop forms part of a wider piece of engagement work that UP Projects and Genuine Fake are doing to develop a new community and culture strategy for the Avenue Road Estate.

Bellway Homes was selected as the Council's preferred bidder following last year's procurement process and will be responsible for preparing detailed plans and delivering new homes, new public spaces and other facilities for residents.

Study Visit to Marlowe Road



Waltham Forest Council are arranging a study visit for Avenue Road Estate residents to visit the borough's Marlowe Road regeneration scheme on:

- Friday 25th February, 11am & 4pm
- Saturday 26th February, 12pm

The purpose of this study visit will be to help residents visualise another regeneration scheme and view the internal layouts of some of the council's new homes in the borough.

At this study visit, there will be an opportunity to view the internal layouts of 1 bed, 2 bed, 3 bed apartments, as well as a visit to a house.

Dependent on the timeslot which you wish to attend, you will need to arrive on time (at 11am or 4pm on 25.2.2022 or 12pm on 26.2.2022) as the regeneration team will be meeting with residents outside the:

Plaza (by the Post Office and near Wood Street Station) located on Wood Street, E17 3HX

The best way to travel here, which includes the least walking distance is as follows:

- Bus Route 339 head towards Leytonstone, and alighting at Leytonstone Station/Grove Green
- 2) Switch here for the W16 heading towards Chingford Mount, and alighting at Wood Green Station

ITRA Update:




NewmanFrancis are your Independent Tenants' & Residents' Advice Service (ITRA).

As part of our service over the coming months, we will:

- Continue to facilitate regular Residents'
 Regeneration Project Group (RRPG)
 meetings. The RRPG is a group that is made
 up of residents living on the estate.
- Support your RRPG with meeting with the developer and addressing community questions.
- Outreach to help residents understand how the regeneration proposals could impact them.
- Development of the draft residents' charter (documentation which highlights the council's commitments & guarantees to residents throughout the regeneration process.)
