

# BLACKHORSE VILLAGE PERCEPTION SURVEY

In 2014, Waltham Forest Council was awarded £27million by Transport for London to improve the borough's roads and town centres making them great places to live, work and travel around.

Blackhorse Village is one of a series of residential areas to receive funding and become part of the Mini-Holland Villages scheme.

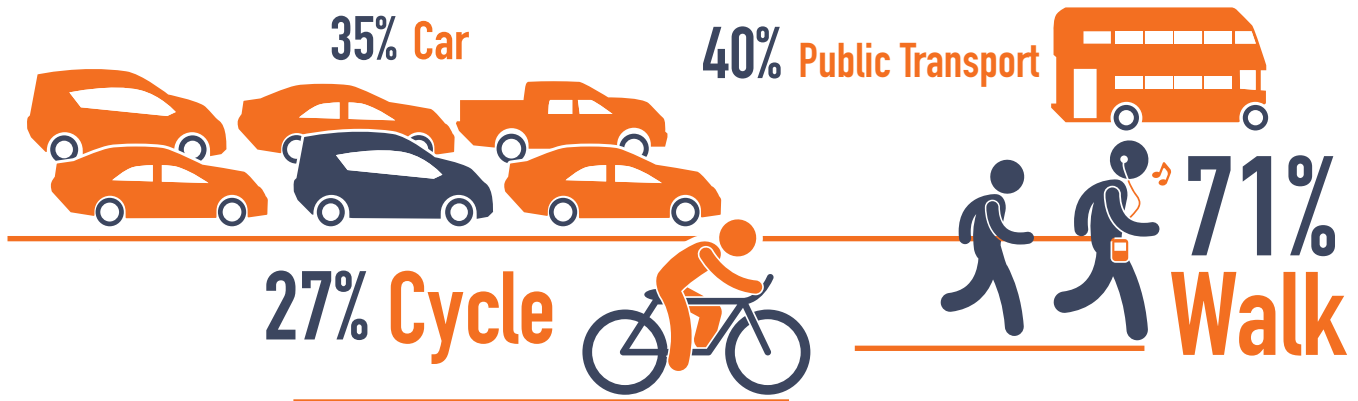
The area is framed by Forest Road, Hoe Street, Selbourne Road and Blackhorse Road, and is popular with people who walk and cycle accessing Blackhorse Road Station, Walthamstow Central Station, St James Street Station, and Walthamstow Market and shopping area.

Between 13 March and 3 April 2015, we conducted a perception survey to find out what local people think about the area and the type of improvements they would like to see.

The survey was made available online and over 5,000 surveys were hand delivered to all households in the area and in total 534 people responded and provided 958 individual comments.

The results from the perception surveys have been used to inform the design for the Blackhorse Village scheme.

69% of respondents feel that some areas in the Blackhorse Village area are unattractive



and 73% think that some areas don't feel safe.
