

CHESTNUTS HOUSE

Chestnuts House is a Grade II* listed former mansion built in the 1740s on the edge of what was the village of Walthamstow. It has been used for a range of uses and retains a number of its original features including an impressive main staircase.

It is arranged with a stable block extension to the north of the main house (known at the Coach House) and a large private front courtyard.

Chestnuts House is less than a 10 minute walk to Walthamstow Central Station.
