ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 – SECTION 35

**AMENDMENT TO HOUSING ESTATE CAR PARK – WADHAM AVENUE E17 AMENDMENTS
(T68(24))**

The Waltham Forest (Housing Estates Car Parks) (No. 1) (Amendment No. *) Order 202*

1. **NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the Council of the London Borough of Waltham Forest propose to make the above-mentioned Order under section 35 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended.
2. The general effect of the Order would be, following the introduction of permit parking on off street areas of Wadham Avenue E17 to provide and regulate:
 - (a) 1 electric vehicle only parking bay replacing one 'H-WD' permit holder only bay outside Nos. 69 to 85 which would be available to vehicles plugged in and charging via a charging lead only at all times and only permitted for a maximum stay of 5 hours between 7.30am and 10.30 pm on Mondays to Sundays inclusive. No such vehicle which has been taken away shall return during the controlled hours until the expiration of 5 hours;
 - (b) 1 electric vehicle 'H-WD' permit holder only bay replacing one 'H-WD' permit holder only bay outside Nos. 69 to 85 which would be available to 'H-WD' resident permit holders, carers permit holders, visitor permit holders, business permit holders, tradesperson permit holders, essential user permit holder and essential user pool permit holders provided that the vehicle is plugged in and charging via a charging lead at all times and only permitted for a maximum stay of 5 hours between 7.30am and 10.30 pm on Mondays to Sundays inclusive. No such vehicle which has been taken away shall return during the controlled hours until the expiration of 5 hours;
 - (c) Swapping the positions of the solo motorcycle only 'H-WD' permit holder only bay and the neighbouring 'H-WD' permit holder only bay located adjacent to No.55; and
 - (d) 5 'H-WD' permit holder only bays replacing the 3 disabled blue badge holders only bays.
 - (e) "at any time" waiting restrictions in the remainder of that road other than where the parking places referred to in sub-paragraph 3(a-d) above would be provided.
3. The above measures are necessary to ensure that parking and waiting facilities are maintained for the use of eligible residents of the estate, their visitors, and other permit holders agreed by the Council. These measures will also prevent parking and waiting where it could cause an obstruction, particularly to emergency services and refuse collection vehicles.
4. Copies of the Orders, the Council's statement of reasons for proposing to make the Orders and a plan showing the locations and effect of the Orders and other measures can be inspected until the end of a period of 6 weeks from the date on which the Order is made or, as the case may be, the Council decides not to make the Orders, on request by either emailing traffic.scheme@walthamforest.gov.uk, or visiting the Highways and Traffic Management office (*by appointment), Low Hall, Argall Avenue, E10 7AS during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays inclusive, or alternatively documents can be viewed online at: www.walthamforest.gov.uk/content/road-traffic-schemes-and-consultations.
