## PERMANENT MAKING OF EXPERIMENTAL CONTROLLED PARKING ZONES (CPZs) (T69ab(24))

COOLGARDIE (CG) CPZ (ref: T69a(24); exp. ref T19a(23)) AND HIGHAMS PARK STATION (HPS) CPZ (ref: T69b(24); exp. ref T19b(23))

The Waltham Forest (Charged-For Parking Places) (Amendment No. 223) Order 2024 and The Waltham Forest (Free Parking Places, Loading Places and Waiting, Loading and Stopping Restrictions) (Amendment No. 220) Order 2024 [relating to CG CPZ];

The Waltham Forest (Charged-For Parking Places) (Amendment No. 224) Order 2024 and The Waltham Forest (Free Parking Places, Loading Places and Waiting, Loading and Stopping Restrictions) (Amendment No. 221) Order 2024 [relating to HPS CPZ];

- 1. **NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the Council of the London Borough of Waltham Forest on **26**<sup>th</sup> **September 2024** made the above-mentioned Orders under sections 6, 45, 46, 49 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.
- **2.** The general effect of the Orders will be to:
  - (a) continue indefinitely the provisions of The Waltham Forest (Charged-For Parking Places) (Amendment No. 165) Experimental Order 2023 and The Waltham Forest (Free Parking Places, Loading Places and Waiting, Loading and Stopping Restrictions) (Amendment No. 164) Experimental Order 2023 [relating to CG CPZ] the effects of which:
    - (i) introduced 'CG' permit holders parking places and single yellow line waiting restrictions in Coolgardie Avenue (between Larkshall Road E4 and the northern arm of Warboys Crescent E4), all provisions and restrictions operating between the hours of 10am and 4pm Mondays to Fridays;
    - (ii) formalised the disabled persons' parking bay outside No. 20 Coolgardie Avenue.
  - (b) continue indefinitely the provisions of The Waltham Forest (Charged-For Parking Places) (Amendment No. 166) Experimental Order 2023; and The Waltham Forest (Free Parking Places, Loading Places and Waiting, Loading and Stopping Restrictions) (Amendment No. 165) Experimental Order 2023 [relating to HPS CPZ] the effects of which:
    - (i) introduced 'HPS' permit holders parking places and single yellow line waiting restrictions in Beech Hall Road E4 (between Beech Hall Crescent and Hale End Road), Beverley Road E4 and Hale End Road E4 (between Larkshall Road and Beverley Road), all provisions and restrictions operating between 8am and 6.30pm Mondays to Fridays;
    - (ii) introduced double yellow line "at any time" waiting restrictions at the northern extremity of Beverley Road and across the kerb build-out adjacent to No. 100 Beech Hall Road.

New parking permit eligibility along with variations in pricing for certain parking permits (based on vehicle emissions and other criteria) will apply on the anniversary/renewal of any permit granted for use in these CPZs. These conditions became effective from 1<sup>st</sup> February 2024. Further details will be explained when renewing permits, or see www.walthamforest.gov.uk/service-categories/parking-permits

- 3. In respect of permits to park in each individual zone, the properties specified in the previous experimental orders will continue indefinitely in the permanent orders and only those properties specified will be able to obtain permits to park in a specific zone only.
- **4.** For all CPZs mentioned in this notice, residents and business permits will continue to be charged on a basis of CO<sub>2</sub> emissions (or, for older vehicles, engine size) and number of vehicles registered to a household. Residents visitor permits will be obtainable as paperless permits at a rate of £1/hour. - **5.** Copies of the Orders, which will come into operation from **26**<sup>th</sup> **September 2024** and all other relevant documents can be inspected until the expiration of a period of 6 weeks from that date on request by either emailing <a href="mailto:traffic.scheme@walthamforest.gov.uk">traffic.scheme@walthamforest.gov.uk</a> or visiting (\*by appointment) the Highways and Traffic Management office, Low Hall. **6.** Any person desiring to question the validity of either of the Orders or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the relevant powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or that any of the relevant requirements thereof or of any relevant regulations made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Orders may, within six weeks of the making of the Orders, make application for the purpose to the High Court
