Dear Resident / Business,

Wadley Road – Flood Resilience Scheme – Construction Notification

Following the extreme flooding in Waltham Forest during the summer 2021, we have developed a flood resilience scheme to help protect homes and businesses in your area. After successfully completing works on Esther Road and King's Passage, we are now moving forward with the final phase of the project on Wadley Road. This phase of the works is set to commence during the week beginning Monday 21 October 2024, with construction expected to last approximately four months.

Construction Phases

The construction work on Wadley Road will be carried out in phases to minimise disruption as much as possible. Below is an outline of the planned phases:

Phase 1: Lytton Road to Temple Close Junction

During this phase, access to Temple Close and Ripley Mews will be maintained from Colworth Road only. Please note that on-street parking within the work area will be suspended for the duration of this phase.

Phase 2: Temple Close Junction (Critical Works)

The works at the junction of Wadley Road and Temple Close will take approximately one week. During this time, there will be no vehicular access to Temple Close and Ripley Mews. Residents will be notified well in advance of the specific dates. Pedestrian access to all properties will be maintained at all times.

Phase 3: Temple Close Junction to Colworth Road Junction

Access to Temple Close and Ripley Mews will be maintained from Lytton Road only for the duration of this phase.

Throughout the construction period, every effort will be made to minimise disruption. However, some noise and inconvenience is inevitable. We greatly appreciate your patience and understanding during this time. Pedestrian access to all properties will be maintained at all times, and the site team will work closely with residents and businesses to address any concerns.

What to Expect: The first stage of construction will involve signing and guarding the work areas, establishing welfare facilities, and minor excavation at various locations along Wadley Road. As with previous phases of the scheme, we will introduce Sustainable Drainage Systems (SuDS) such as rain gardens and permeable surfacing to reduce surface water flooding.

Collection of Impounded vehicles and payments for the release of a vehicle are to be made using the details outlined above.
